Writing A Paragraph

What is a Paragraph?

A paragraph is a number of sentences that are organized and coherent, and are related to ONE single idea.

Every well-organised paragraph has three parts:

It starts with a controlling idea called **TOPIC SENTENCE** which expresses the controlling main idea of the paragraph.

The **BODY** of the paragraph is a number of sentences that discuss the controlling idea.

The **CONCLUSION**, the last sentence in a paragraph, refers to the topic sentence and sums up the main idea of the paragraph or might be a suggestion or advice for the reader.

Types of Paragraphs

- The Narrative Paragrap tells a story
- The Persuasive Paragraph
 tries to convince the audience
- The Descriptive Paragraph describes something
- The Expository Paragraph
 explains something
- The Opinion Paragraph
 tells what you think and why

The Opinion Paragraph

In our course we will practice writing an opinion paragraph. In a typical *Opinion Paragraph*,

- The *topic sentence* is your opinion.
- There are **THREE supporting reasons** why you have this opinion.
- The *conclusion* can be restatement of the topic sentence or advice to the reader.
- You should use *linking words* to organize your paragraph.
